SUCCESS STORIES

V-Excel works with children and young adults with cognitive and developmental disabilities such as Autism Spectrum Disorder, Intellectual challenges, Attention Deficit, Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD/ADD), Behavioural and Emotional Disorders, and Learning Disabilities such as Dyslexia. Every success is achieved by overcoming challenges, backed by perseverant efforts from teachers, trainers, counsellors and administrators. These are some of the year's success stories:

Gokulakrishna Subramani joined V-Excel's vocational training program in Mylapore, Chennai, when he was 18. Gokula is a slow learner with mild intellectual disability. He was shy, timid and calm. With training, patience and perseverance, he steadily progressed in learning new skills. His training program covered soft skills, personality development, personal grooming and vocational skill development.



Over time, his confidence improved and his gait and posture were more composed and confident. After a few months of intense counselling and priming, Gokula was placed in a reputed hotel chain. However, the pandemic struck and he lost his job within days of joining. V-Excel continued to be in touch with him and continued to provide the services for him to remain on-track and focussed.

Post-COVID, V-Excel found Gokula another opportunity with a different hotel chain. He joined there as a trainee and climbed up to become a part of their payroll. He was progressing well and was part of the Front Office team there. However, the hotel was acquired and shut down, and Gokula lost his job again. His parents grew anxious and worried.

But with dedication and devotion from V-Excel's staff and after a wait of 5 months, Gokula was placed at the Rane Group of Companies at their corporate office in Guindy. Gokula is involved in back-office work and has one of his colleagues mentoring him. He is enjoying his work and his workplace. With the Rane team's support, he has settled well. We are very grateful to the management, not just for affording this opportunity to Gokula, but also for allowing us to conduct an awareness session at their workplace.

SUCCESS STORIES

Rekha Vijaykumar – is a 22-year young woman, who joined KLC when she was 10. She worked hard with her teachers in improving her skills, working on her emotional difficulties, showing interest in all activities of the class, becoming confident, taking care of her peers, leading, and helping them and the teachers. As she grew up, she excelled in all the vocational skills, be it cooking, stitching, candle making, carpentry, and worked responsibly and with precision in everything that she did.

She got an opportunity to be part of a training program at Writer's Cafe for 6 months. Her teachers and counselor supported her in overcoming the challenges she faced there. Looking at her work and assessing her skills, Writer's Cafe offered her a permanent job with them from June.



Akshaya Saravanan, a 29-year young woman, joined YES in 2018. She was diagnosed with intellectual disabilities. Despite academic challenges, Akshaya finished school until Class X. At YES, she was trained in several aspects of Printing and Documentation and in Culinary Skills. She exhibited a great willingness to learn and was able to follow instructions easily.

Akshaya interned at Writer's Cafe for 6 months and was absorbed as a full-time employee upon completion of her internship.

April 2024

Moving from Surviving to Thriving. This year's theme for World Autism Awareness Day, championed by the United Nations, emphasizes the importance of shifting the focus from simply coping with autism to creating an environment where autistic individuals can flourish. This includes ensuring access to:

- 1. Early diagnosis and intervention: Early intervention programs can significantly improve outcomes for autistic children.
- 2. Quality education: Inclusive education settings that cater to individual needs are crucial for success.
- Supportive employment: Creating opportunities for meaningful employment fosters independence and selfesteem.
- 4. Mental health support: Autistic individuals are more prone to anxiety and depression. Access to mental health services is essential.

A week later, the YES was invited to Equitas along with the 2 shortlisted trainees, Srinidhi Sekar and Hariharan Natarajan. Mr. John Alex, ED, Equitas interacted with the trainees and was impressed with their skills and potential. Both trainees were selected for internships.



May 2024

In a significant initiative to support children with special needs, Sri Ramanasramam is partnering with V-Excel Educational Trust to launch the **Bhagavan Ramana Center for Specially-Abled Children** (BRC-SAC) in Tiruvannamalai on May 6th. This collaborative effort will provide free special education and therapeutic rehabilitation services, encompassing early intervention for children aged 0 to 8, remedial education for those aged 3 to 14, along with lunch and transportation for children from lower socio-economic backgrounds.

Seven graduates were introduced to all the trainees and then were split into groups to engage in vocational activities. Trainees taught the groups bead work, quilling art, jute braiding, tailoring, block printing and scanning of documents. It was a new experience for the volunteers. They interacted well with the trainees They also played some therapeutic games related to eye-hand coordination, bilateral function, focus and attention.

May 2024



Ms. Gayathri Suryanarayanan, the Center Coordinator of YES, successfully completed a 10week **online course on CSR Funding**. The course was organized and conducted by ImpactYog and Metapram

program, a team of 12 enthusiastic volunteers and their families visited YES on May 11th. The visit commenced with an orientation session focused on understanding special needs and adults with special needs. The volunteers brought thoughtful gifts of games and fruits for the trainees and actively engaged with them for around four hours through shared activities like conversation, singing, dancing, group art, and indoor games. The positive interactions continued during lunch with the YES team, where the volunteers shared their enriching experiences with the trainees.



June 2024

A group of 35 students and staff from YES, Chennai, recently experienced the "Local '24" Art and Design exhibition at the Lalit Kala Akademi.

Curated by Ms. Aishwarya Manivannan of Maisha Studio, the exhibition featured artworks by 16 of her students, centered around themes of connection and interactive learning. The exhibition presented a diverse collection of around 100 pieces spanning fine art, painting, drawing, installations, sculptures, film, photography, fashion, and product design, all created by 16 talented individuals aged 16 to 23. Maisha Studio generously sponsored the transportation and refreshments for the YES visitors, who each received an artwork bookmark as a memento of their visit.





On June 7th, as part of the Early Intervention (EI)
Unit's outreach program, a sensitization session
was conducted for the teachers of Olcott School
by Ms. Lekshmi Ramesh and Ms. Nasrath Banu. Ms.
Ramesh addressed the significance of early
intervention, explaining its benefits for children with
special needs and emphasizing its collaborative
nature, involving parents, the school, and the early
intervention team in addressing the child's needs.
Furthermore, the teachers received an orientation on
various learning styles and their impact on both
teaching methodologies and the learning process. A
total of 12 teachers participated in the session.

As part of the El Unit's outreach program, supported by Chola MS General Insurance, a **screening camp was conducted at Cathedral Free Primary School** from June 19 to 21. During the camp, students from grades I through V underwent screening. A total of 122 children were screened, and the scoring and interpretations are currently being compiled in order to commence the intervention programs.

June 2024

Every year, International Yoga Day is observed on June 21st to commemorate the physical and spiritual benefits yoga has brought globally. The theme for the 10th annual celebration was "Yoga for Self and Society." The term "Yoga" originates from Sanskrit, signifying "to join" or "to unite," symbolizing the integration of body and consciousness. Yoga offers a holistic approach to health and well-being by uniting the body, mind, spirit, and soul. Its transformative power is the focus of this special day of recognition.

In V-Excel, Yoga Day was celebrated across the organization on June 21st. The students performed a variety of asanas, demonstrating that individuals of all abilities could participate and practice yoga according to their own capabilities.

VTU Adyar organized a puja in which five priests performed the **Ganapathy, Navagraham and Lakshmi Hayagriva homam**. Charu, Uma, Mani, and Sushma joined in the homam chanting and performed the puja along with the priests. The homams were an auspicious way to seek blessings for the year ahead and to overcome any challenges that may arise.







July 2024

Guru Seva Nirata Sri PA Murali, Administrator & CEO of Sringeri Math visited V-Excel on July 8. He came to V-Excel's head office, Sharada, took a walk-through of the entire building. He peeped into every room and spent time understanding the scope of the work that was being done.

The group then proceeded to the Manimandapam of Jagadguru Shri Chandrasekharendra Saraswati Mahaswamigal at Orikkai. At the temple and gurukulam, the YES team distributed small bags of notebooks and stationery, to the gurukulam students. In return, the gurukulam students chanted mantras, including the *Dhanvantri Slokam*, for the wellbeing of the YES trainees. The YES team had lunch at the Orikkai temple's Bhojanaalayam. The highlight of the visit was an audience with the Kanchi Mutt Peetathipathi Sri Vijayendra Saraswati Swamigal, who showed great interest in the organization and blessed the group.



July 2024

The vocational students at KLC explored the inspirational story of Joan of Arc through a **trip to Pondicherry**. Carefully planned to encourage listening, observation, drawing, and real-world engagement beyond the school environment, the students visited the garden and Notre Dame Church, where Joan's statue stands. Their day involved navigating traffic, managing hunger, practicing independence at hotels, observing silence at church, enjoying the beach freely, showing reverence at an artists' village, and encountering diverse people, sounds, sights, challenges, and joys.



Despite being divided into teams (blue, yellow, black, and white), the V-Excel team experienced favorable weather as the usual Chennai heat gave way to overcast skies for their "V-Excel Premier League (VPL)". The energetic cricket match was played with enthusiasm. July 2024

The much-awaited **registration certificate for V-Excel Nashik was renewed** by the Office of the Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Maharashtra State, Pune.

On July 20th, a group of 14 students and 12 staff from V-Excel Erode visited the Mettur Dam to expose students to real-life situations, fostering critical thinking, social and communication skills, teamwork, and community building. Their visit included a jaggery production unit where staff explained the making process. At the Mettur Dam, they experienced pleasant weather, viewed the dam from the viewpoint and higher levels, and observed the significant water flow due to rains. The group enjoyed packed food and snacks, visited a park where the children played, and explored the aquarium within the park.





On July 1st, **Arpith Ashok**, a trainee from **YES**, **Mylapore**, **commenced his internship** at the CA firm P.S. Subramania lyer & Co. . He will be supporting the back-office team with tasks such as scanning and photocopying. This opportunity will also allow Arpith to further develop his social and communication skills. The organization extends its best wishes to Arpith for his future endeavors.

August 2024

On August 2nd, 2024, V-Excel Educational Trust achieved a significant step towards its goal of expanding its reach to Tier 2 and Tier 3 towns with the **inauguration of its 22nd center in Kolapakkam**. This milestone was made possible through the initiative of RASEE Charitable Trust, with the support of Super Auto Forge, to provide free rehabilitation services to children with special needs in neighboring villages.









On August 10, 2024, **Disha, the parent forum of V-Excel Educational Trust, was reinitiated** at The Mylapore Club in Mylapore, with 30 parents in attendance. Following an invocation and the lighting of the traditional lamp, Ms. Charumathi Sriram, Coordinator of the Vocational Training Unit (VTU), welcomed the gathering and emphasized the significance of such support groups. Inspiring speeches were then delivered by Dr. Vasudha Prakash, Founder-Director of V-Excel Educational Trust, and the guest speaker, Ms. Radha Ramesh, Proprietor of Twin Twigs.

A panel discussion, moderated by Ms. Gayathri Suryanarayanan, Center Coordinator for Youth Empowerment Services, ensued, where participating parents shared their personal experiences and journeys. The forum was subsequently opened for a question-and-answer session, with Dr. Vasudha and Ms. Radha jointly addressing the queries. The event concluded with legal insights shared by Prof. Anand Jagadeesan, a discussion of future plans for Disha, and a lunch for all attendees.

August 2024

Young Indians (Yi) invited V-Excel Educational Trust to their second edition of 'Walk Along 2.0', an Accessibility Walk held on August 11, at the Namma Chennai Park. The event, supported by CREDAI Chennai and with the participation of various NGOs, aimed to promote inclusivity, raise disability awareness, and foster community spirit.

From V-Excel, a group of 36 trainees and students representing KLC, YES, and VTU, along with 17 teachers, trainers, staff, and parents, took part in the 600-meter walk. The event was inaugurated by Mr. A.R. Unnikrishnan, Vice Chairman of CII Tamil Nadu; Mr. Ajit Chordia, CII Vice Chairman of the Chennai Zone; and Mr. A. Mohamed Ali, President of CREDAI Chennai.

The walk uniquely paired each person with a disability with a neurotypical participant, walking hand in hand. The Accessibility vertical of Yi focuses on initiatives that encourage empathy over sympathy, thereby creating empowerment opportunities for individuals with disabilities.







V-Excel, in partnership with Sundaram Educational Trust, continues its thirteen-year tradition of presenting "A Class Apart" to mainstream schools in Chennai. This year-long professional development program, conducted over three three-day sessions, addresses the diverse learning challenges faced by neurodivergent individuals.

Beyond skill development, the program aims to transform educators' perspectives, fostering an internal framework to navigate the daily complexities of inclusive classrooms. The first module of this year's program engaged 37 teachers from 22 schools in dynamic activities involving movement, painting, singing, listening, and speaking. Through these experiences, the teachers learned that learning is inclusive and leaves no child behind in the classroom.

August 2024

Sangam '24, the sports meet hosted by V-Excel Educational Trust, was a significant success. Held at St. Bede's playground in Santhome, Chennai, over two days on August 22nd and 23rd, the event was the culmination of months of planning, including invitations to other institutions serving special children/adults and the organization of preliminary rounds at their respective premises. A total of 352 children and adults from seven special schools, including V-Excel, participated, with 160 participants engaging in activities on the first day. The efforts of each participant were acknowledged with a Certificate of Appreciation.







V-Excel's skill trainer Ms. Bagavathi Raman, who has been with the Vocational Training Unit in Adyar since 2018, was featured in "A Life in the Day..." series of The Hindu on August 24.

As part of the EI Unit's outreach program supported by the Atos Prayas Foundation, a **screening camp was conducted at Reddiyarpatti Government Primary School in Tirunelveli** from August 6th to 9th, 2024. Students in grades I through V were screened during this period. Out of a total of 232 children examined, 46 were identified as having significant difficulties with their psychomotor development and/or learning.

August 2024

Niharikaa Dinakaran, a senior student in KLC, met the criteria for the **second training batch at Writer's Cafe**. Following her application, she was interviewed,. Through the process she demonstrated confidence and composure while responding effectively to the questions. She was then selected for a six-month training program at the Cafe.



V-Excel Nashik has received a **Certificate as a DISHA Implementing School**. The DISHA program, an initiative of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, centers on early intervention and ensuring school readiness for children with developmental disabilities. This certification recognizes V-Excel Nashik's commitment to empowering students with special needs to reach their full potential.





In Nashik, students from Bridges Learning Academy's Vocational Unit and Learning Centre collaborated on a group dance centered around **Mental Stress Awareness**, using a medley of "All is Well," "Fikar Not," and "Love You Zindagi." Their impactful performance secured second place in the competition, marking the academy's third consecutive year winning a trophy. Adding to the academy's success, Aarisha lyer and Himanshu Gupta, also from Bridges Learning Academy, received special medals for their exceptional individual contributions. This achievement underscores the students' artistic talent and V-Excel's ongoing dedication to addressing significant social issues through creative expression.

August 2024

During the District Differently Abled Welfare Officer's inspection at OutReach, Pollachi, the accessibility and support systems for special students were noted as largely adequate, with specific mention of ramps, specialized teaching aids, and the use of individualized education plans. The officer identified areas for improvement, suggesting additional staff training and more inclusive classroom materials. The inspection concluded with recommendations aimed at enhancing overall inclusivity and ensuring adherence to accessibility standards. As a token of appreciation, the officer received a memento featuring vocational training products crafted by the





school's special young adults.

For their monthly PTA meeting on August 10, 2024,

Anandam Special School organized an open house for parents. A thematic presentation showcasing the school's working system was displayed and explained. Teachers facilitated a walk-in for admission to the therapist curriculum and other activities, demonstrating their individualized approach with diverse materials. Parents toured the conceptual displays and expressed satisfaction with the students' learning experiences. The school's Managing Trustee, Smt. Bhageerathi Ramamurthy, also visited the school to view the exhibition.

Gayathri Suryanarayanan from YES successfully completed the **Associate Certification in Gestalt Psychology** through the Anil Thomas Fellowship Program. This 60-hour virtual program, held from August 15th to 18th, 2024, involved self-exploration, therapy sessions, and a written integration. Moderators evaluated the participants based on these components, and scoring was determined accordingly.



September 2024

On September 4, 2024, V-Excel Educational Trust was invited to showcase and sell products from its three Chennai units at the Inner Wheel Club of Chennai's **Symphony Bazaar**, held at Chhajer Bhavan. Several V-Excel trainees actively participated, engaging with shoppers and proudly describing the production processes.



The products were well-received, fostering connections with the organization's mission as visitors took the time to understand V-Excel's work. The event also resulted in advance orders for Navratri and promising leads for future collaborations, making it a truly fruitful day.



OutReach, Pollachi celebrated its 8th anniversary on

September 17. Reflecting on this milestone, Mr. Bala (Board Member) and Dr. Manju (Managing Trustee) expressed their gratitude to Dr. Vasudha Prakash, the guiding force of V-Excel, whose influence has drawn individuals like them to the organization since 2017. Today, the Outreach team remembers all direct and indirect patrons of V-Excel who have placed their trust in them and offered invaluable support during challenging times.

Mrs. Lekshmi Ramesh, Unit Head of Early Intervention and Remedial Services, was honored with the **Rotary Excellence Award for Special Children School Teachers** by Rotary International District 3233. September 2024



The Owl House in Goa, a community service initiative offering skill support for individuals and families with neurological differences, conducts Fellowship programs for those interested in working with their students. On the concluding day of a recent Fellowship training period, **Gita Bhalla served as the panel expert**. Her session involved an in-depth discussion on the 12 senses, complemented by the in-house expertise of building bridges and fostering parent collaboration, with contributions from a few teachers of KLC

Shri Narwade interacted informally with the parents, sharing real-life experiences and explaining relevant legal clauses and the benefits of legal guardianship. The information he provided offered both teachers and parents a new perspective on this crucial aspect of planning for the well-being of their adult children with special needs.

It recognizes the crucial role teachers play in shaping the future by imparting knowledge, fostering critical thinking, and inspiring students. At Erode V-Excel, Teachers' Day was celebrated on September 21st, 2024, in a simple yet heartfelt manner. A lunch and a small token of appreciation were arranged for all staff members.



September 2024

V-Excel Educational Trust, Solapur, and Maitra Foundation hosted a workshop for parents focusing on adolescence. Psychologist Prajakta Dhumal from the Tathapi Trust in Pune guided parents on topics including body literacy, the physical and mental changes adolescents experience, physical hygiene, and essential care. She also addressed how to navigate these issues specifically when raising children with special needs. The parents' questions were answered by Sujata Lohokare, Sunita Vaidya, and Prajakta Dhumal.





On September 4, YES (Youth Empowerment Services) and the VTU (Vocational Training Unit) team were invited to host a **product stall for the employees of Grundfos** at their company premises. The stall operated from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Yuvaraj and Sujanya, along with trainee Arvind Ramprasad, managed the stall during the first half of the day, while the VTU team took over for the latter half. The products were well-received, with the millet laddoos, handmade notebooks, and laptop sleeves garnering particular praise.

October 2024

On October 5th, 2024, Nandha College of Physiotherapy invited the Erode center of V-Excel Educational Trust to participate in their **cultural and sports meet**, organized in observance of World Cerebral Palsy Day. V-Excel Erode actively participated in both the sports and cultural events, achieving winning positions in several games. In a gesture of inclusivity, all participants received certificates recognizing their performance, as the organizers chose to honor everyone rather than solely announcing winners this year. The Head of the Department conveyed special appreciation to both the students and teachers for their success, participation, and representation for the second consecutive year.

The Madras Dyslexia Association (MDA) organized a 'Dyslexia Awareness Walk' starting from Besant Nagar Beach in Chennai at 7:00 AM on October 20, 2024. This event was part of a series of activities planned to commemorate 'Dyslexia Awareness Month', observed globally every October. These efforts were aimed to increase awareness among the local community, parents, and schools regarding the facts about dyslexia and individuals with dyslexia.



V-Excel was among the participants in the event. The designated color for the day was red, chosen due to its common association with highlighting spelling errors and low grades in school. Each trainee from V-Excel who participated received a certificate of participation.

October 2024

A significant highlight of October 2024 was TATTVA, an art exhibition curated entirely by the YES (Youth Empowerment Services) team of V-Excel Educational Trust. Planning and preparations for the event commenced in August, incorporating several new initiatives and ideas from the outset. TATTVA 2024 saw participation from 11 special schools, in addition to three centers of V-Excel. A total of 128 special artists showcased 178 artworks and photographs at Alliance Française on October 26, 2024. Key features of TATTVA 2024 included the inclusion of individual artists, a professional gallery setup, a day-long event, the auctioning of selected artwork, and the formation of volunteer groups from corporate organizations. The exhibition proved to be a resounding success, with a total of 160 artworks and photographs sold. The YES team expressed their excitement and gratitude for the widespread appreciation and positive feedback received.







On Vijayadasami, October 12, 2024, V-Excel Educational Trust, in collaboration with Super Auto Forge, **inaugurated a new early intervention center at Unamancheri**, located on the Kolapakkam highway. This center provides services free of charge to children with special needs.

The opening ceremony included a prayer, followed by consultations and assessments for children. Those children who were assessed and deemed eligible for interventions were invited to begin their therapy sessions the following week.

October 2024

On October 16, 2024, a **mental health awareness session** was conducted for all teaching and administrative staff in Nashik by the school counselor, Smt. Pradnya Apte. The session centered on the well-being of teachers, highlighting the importance of identifying and managing their own stress levels. Teachers received guidance on strategies for maintaining mental health, reducing stress, and enhancing their overall well-being, with a strong emphasis on the necessity of self-care in their demanding professions.



A **special performing arts program** was organized by Bal Rangabhumi Nashik for special children, providing a platform for students from Bridges Learning Academy (BLA), Vocational Training Unit (VTU), and Learning Centre (VLC) to display their talents. Additionally, themes such as "Circus," "Child Labour," and "Mangalyaan" were beautifully portrayed by the children through various performances. October 2024

November 2024

The film chronicles the transformative journey of Chandramouli Ramadoss, a young man with special needs, highlighting his remarkable achievements through unwavering support and personalized care at V-Excel. The film's primary goal was to foster public awareness regarding neurodivergent diversity and promote inclusion within mainstream society.



November 2024

On November 13th a **storytelling event** was organized for the remedial and young adult students of OutReach, Pollachi with the support of Round India Table, who facilitated the session. The event utilized interactive pop-up storybooks to enhance learner engagement. The session aimed to improve literacy skills by making storytelling more engaging and visually stimulating. Students actively participated, displaying enthusiasm as they explored the pop-up books and listened to the stories, which helped to enhance their comprehension and imagination.

Seventy-seven organizations participated. This included 74 NGOs and 3 corporates and a total of 169 participants.
