
PROGRAMS

- Remedial Intervention provided for students with a disability to help them succeed in the general education setting.

- Vocational Job skills, basic soft- and hard-skills geared towards vocational development and employability
- Professional Workshops for building awareness and to employ unique teaching strategies for working with special children
- Rural Outreach Education and intervention for individuals with special needs

MONIKA

Monika's journey in V-Excel began in June 2018. She had difficulty in coping with the pressure and expectations of regular school. The school could not understand her individual needs to help her manage. Her struggles worsened and she eventually dropped out while in Class XI. Her self-esteem plummeted and she bore no hope for the future. The team at V-Excel welcomed her on a promising note. She was counselled, and art therapy was introduced to improve her self-confidence and motivation.

She was admitted in NIOS training centre Bridges Learning Academy where she started preparing for her 12th NIOS Exams. With one-to-one training, she regained her self-confidence and completed her Board exams in the first attempt. She is now studying first year BBA in a college at Chennai. Monika is now a confident, cheerful and a motivated student.

DINESH

Dinesh joined our remedial program in June 2019. When he came he was rigid, unwilling to mingle with his classmates and refused to eat without his grandma. He was not toilet-trained, and was reluctant to participate in any activity. Through a focused plan, consistent efforts and unconditional support from the staff, Dinesh blossomed into a new person. In about a month's time he started to greet other children and teachers. He learned to acknowledge teachers with a nod of his head, smile or a short sound. He now wants to take the lead when he sees other children playing and enjoys being in a group and does the activities, and is able to indicate when he wants to use the toilet.

HARIHARAN

Hariharan of Bridges Learning Academy passed his NIOS Senior Secondary Exams with flying colours. He joined BLA in 2014 and came to us with diffidence, low self-esteem and lacking clarity about his future. He was unable to cope in a normal school. At BLA, the staff integrated him in the NIOS curriculum, worked on his self-esteem and helped him gain confidence. Slowly, with sustained motivation, he began to bloom and passed his X exams first and this year his XII. Hariharan benefited from motivation, the congenial atmosphere in BLA, not to mention hard work. He is a source of inspiration for children who wish to achieve but do not know how to achieve.


PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



On June 4, 2019, our new 25-seater school van arrived. We would like to express our deepest gratitude to our Germany-based donor, Yoga Vereinigung Rajagopalan E.V. (YVR). Mr. D. Suresh, AGM, CSR, Ashok Leyland along with Ms. Lakshmi of YVR inaugurated the van.



The Early Intervention Unit conducted a 2-day screening camp in February 2020, at the Ambattur Municipality Primary school, Kallikuppam, for children aged 2 ½ years to 6 years. Sixty-seven children were assessed using a customized assessment tool.



August 29, 2019 marked 18 years of V-Excel Educational Trust – an organization striving to bring meaning and abundance in the lives of persons with special needs. With the student at the center, V-Excel promises a warm, sensitive and caring atmosphere and a commitment to work with clarity, compassion and creativity.

Based on the scoring, children were referred for review program/intervention. As a part of the screening program, the teachers in the school were oriented to identify children with delay in development and take necessary follow-up actions.

Children were incentivized with snacks and gifts.



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



A Science Expo Day was held on 29 November. It covered hand-on activities on air pressure, water cycles, the power of magnets, living and non-living things.



On World Disability Day we expressed solidarity with the community of persons with special needs and we joined the Walkathon on Marina Beach and later participated in the games and awareness walks organised by *Nandavanam*, another special needs centre.



Open Day in KLC was held in the second week of December. Parents attended various activities in the classes and spent time watching their children learn. Senior school parents accompanied the students and teachers to the Sreyes Farm where they spent the whole day.



Eight trainees from YES participated in the 12th Annual Dance Recital of Leo's Dance Academy and performed a medley mix on-stage for a medley mix. PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



In June 2019, our team in Solapur arranged a free check up camp and seminar on autism. Dr. Suneel Godbole and Dr. Ashwini Godbole, Dietitian and Psychologist, assessed 35 children and 20 of these children joined our therapy program.



'One Team - One Goal' - a workshop was presented at our Solapur center by the Paramount Team from Pune. The workshop emphasized the importance of team work, self-development, organization development, communication with parents and other staff members.



We held a free awareness program on Learning Disability for primary teachers and parents of slow learners at Noyal Public School, Kinathukadavu, Pollachi on June 15, 2019. Dr. S. Manju, Director, OutReach Remedial Center, Pollachi conducted the program. 23 primary teachers and 35 parents attended.

Music therapy was introduced for the pre-vocational and primary group children at our Tirunelveli centre. They are being trained to play the keyboard and listening to songs. This helps them calm down and improve their focus and attention.



30 students from AMM Matriculation School, Kotturpuram visited us to interact and have a community lunch. The school is focusing on value education by giving their students exposure to various special schools and to inculcate in them the need to accept and help the differently-abled.

In April, students from Stella Maris College - Post-Graduate students from the Department of Fine Arts; as part of their course ART FOR CHILDREN, came to KLC and worked with 15 students on Marbling on Paper.

THIS WAS A UNIQUE BAZAAR IN MANDAVELI

April 15 morning, V-Excel Educational Trust, a special school based at Thiruvengadam Street, Mandaveli, is buzzing with activity.



Soft music floats around the extensive to the campus. The special students who get a killed here are singing their favourite songs. At one corner, a few people are buying fresh vegetables on sale. At another corner, girls wait for their turn as the talented artist works intricate patterns on the palm of one girl who is enjoying the effort.

This is a carnival like atmosphere. All the stalls set up on the campus, there was something for everybody, from lemon-makes to professional. And all that was on display were made by the special students of V-Excel.

Gita Bhalla, the principal of the special school at V-Excel, Kalolsange Learning Center and the trust's executive director, says, "The products of students at three units, Kalolsange Learning Center, the youth empowerment services and the vocational training unit were displayed at this bazaar. Over 60 students, who have been skilled for a year now had something like 100 items to offer."

The items on display included jute bags, gift items, candle holders and decorative mirrors. There were a few unusual works - a memory board where you can hang memo notes and photographs and art and literature work of the students were also on display.

Says Gita, "Every year, we host such an event on a small scale. We have an exhibition, class-wise, to show to the parents what the students have been working on. This year, the children had made quite a few items, so we decided to have a bazaar."

A couple of parents, whose children have graduated here, have started self-help groups. Items made by these children - like *tilipoti*, *parappu podi* and fashion jewellery - was also on sale.

In some ways, this bazaar pumped up the spirit of the students as well as their guardians as much as it connected with the community.

ORGANIC VEGGIES SELL FAST

Home-grown vegetables were the hot-sellers at the V-Excel Bazaar. The school's principal Gita Bhalla said that within hours of the launch, some one hundred people had purchased their farm-fresh vegetables.



Says Gita, "From Seed to Table, our farming project has been very successful. We started the project eight months ago at our farm at Red Hills with our partners Eesavee Sharada Foundation. Our children were involved in everything, right from the tilling of the soil and preparation of manure to planting of the seed and harvesting. Every week, they would go and stay at the farm for two days and tend to the plants on the farm."

Greens and beans and okra, brinjals and drumstick and a variety of gourds are harvested at this farm. "We get some 6 kilos of each vegetable every harvest," says Gita.

Youths with special needs run mobile food truck
